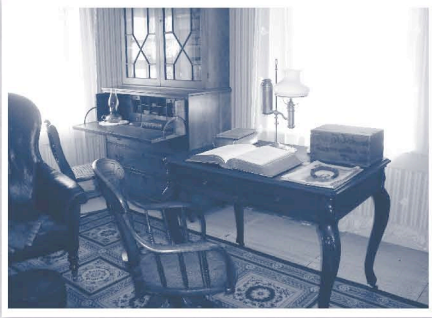


SITES OF INTEREST

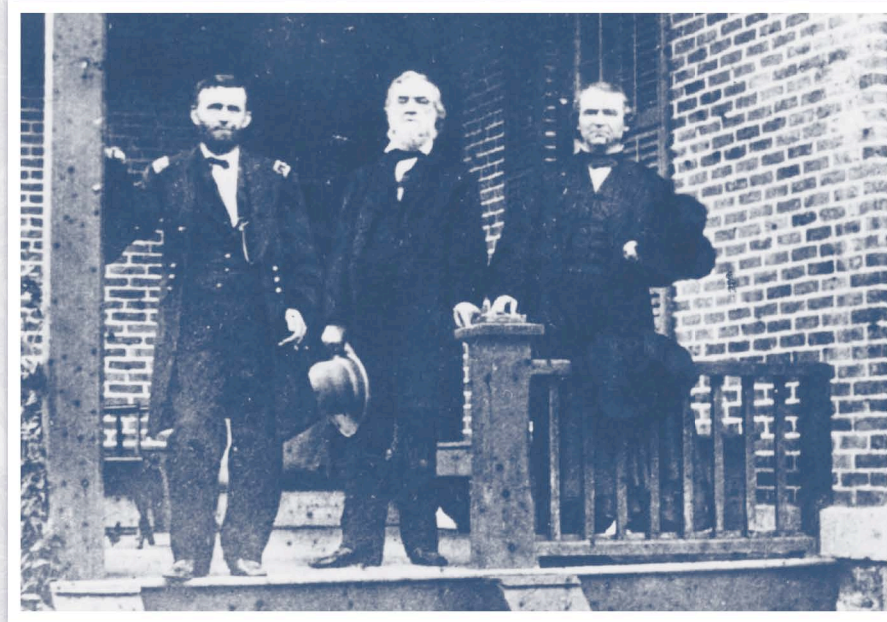

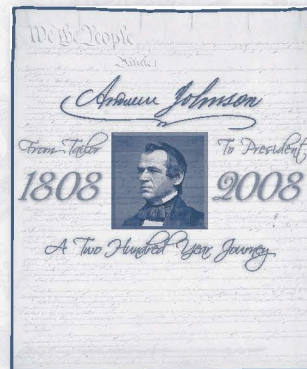

1866 – General Ulysses S. Grant, Secretary of the Navy Gideon Welles, President Andrew Johnson at the home of Secretary of State William Seward

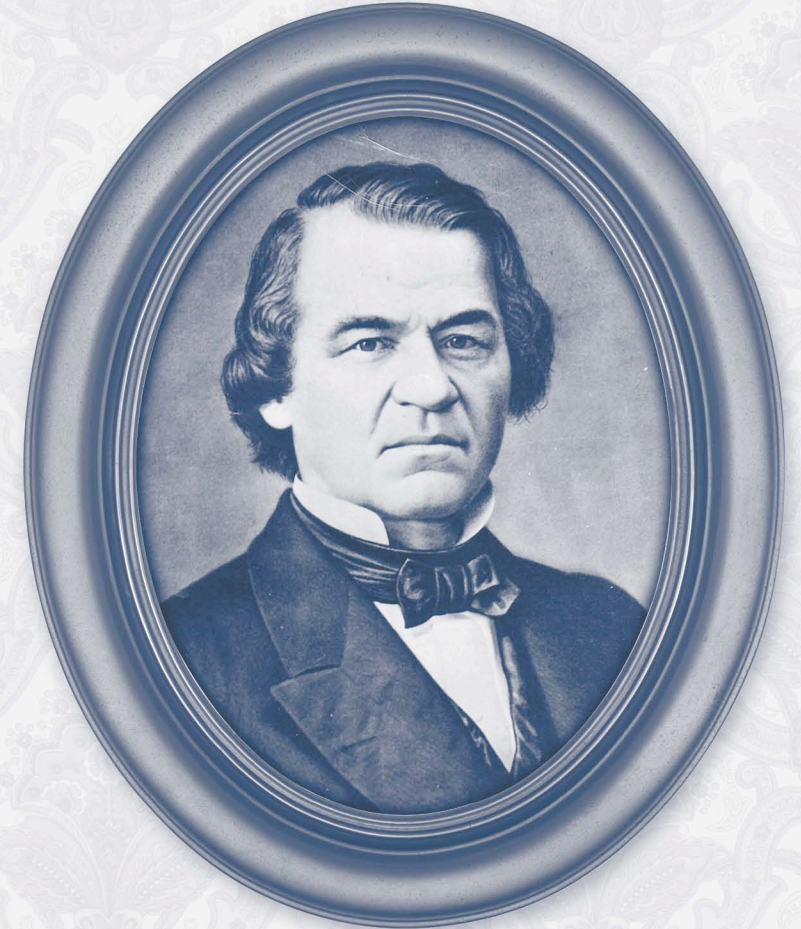

In celebration of the Bicentennial of President Andrew Johnson (1808-1875), this symposium explores the 17th President's impact on the era, the Presidency, and our Constitution. To help us understand this complex man, Dr. Paul Bergeron of the University of Tennessee, Dr. Michael Kent Curtis of Wake Forest University School of Law, Dr. Eric Foner of Columbia University, and Dr. Robert Orr of Walters State and Washington College Academy will convene on the campus of historic Tusculum College. Oliver Thomas, Executive Director of the Niswonger Foundation, will moderate a concluding panel discussion. This symposium, appropriately held during National Constitution Week, will be lively, entertaining, and educational.

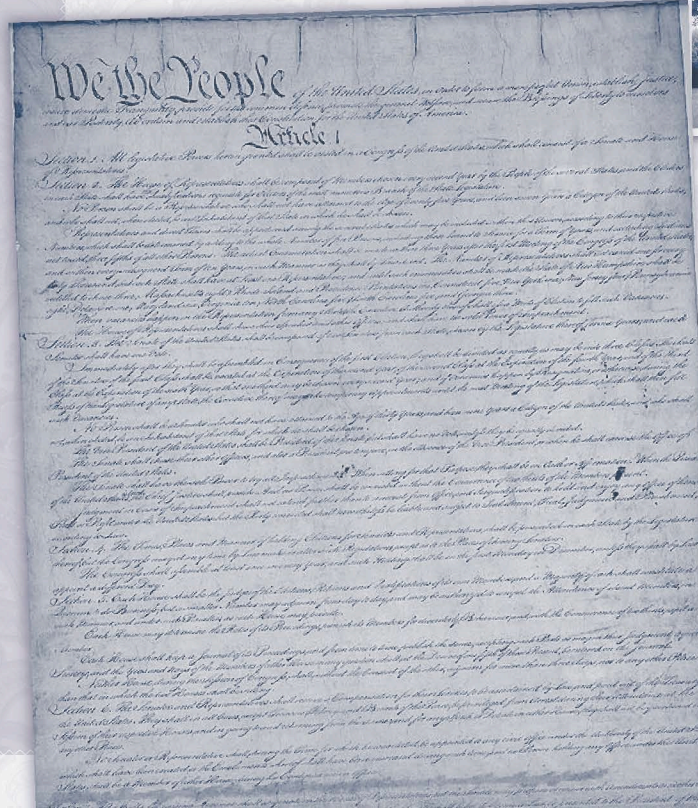
CONSTITUTION DAY CELEBRATION
